- I. Committee Reports

  - 2. Flower Show update

  - Treasurer's Report: Account Balance is \$17,434.00 of which \$1,200 is a restricted grant. Revenue was \$300.00 and expenses are \$2,805.Garden Design magazine sent \$12.00 because of a subscription received. FFGC dues are paid and up to date.

- D. California Pizza Kitchen needs a WGC member to head. Can patronize on Friday, Saturday or Sunday (April 13,14, or 15<sup>th</sup>)and the WGC will benefit. Announcements will be made at March and April WGC meetings.

They will be sold to anyone at a cost of \$18.00 each. Peggy has also offered her home for our garden tour in 2019. This would be a 1 garden tour and on golf carts due to the expansive nature of her garden.

- 10. Garden Art Class February 8, 2018 class will decorate hats donated by Kathy Hernicz as door hangers. Can be sold at the Flower Show.
- 11. Gene Joyner's Restoration Barbara H reported that 7 Master Gardeners participated in addition to the Scouts who gave their pledge, saluted the American Flag, and received their Tree Badge in the Unbelievable Acres garden. Larry Grosser has been a huge help with this project. The Palm Beach Post article on January 7, 2018 highlighted the restoration process.
