

Florida's Aquatic Preserve Program
Featured Speaker: Irene Arpayoglou



Irene is the Indian River Lagoon Aquatic Preserves (IRLAP) Manager for the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. IRLAP manages seven of the state's 41 aquatic preserves; Mosquito Lagoon, Banana River, Indian River Lagoon from Malabar to Vero Beach, Vero Beach to Ft. Pierce and Ft. Pierce to Jupiter Inlet, Loxahatchee River – Lake Worth Creek, and North Fork of the St. Lucie River.

Irene will present a program on the work that her office does, such as shore bird surveys, seagrass monitoring, spoil island management, diamond back terrapin genetic study, exotic species removal, oyster reef monitoring education, outreach, public use, access and more.

#### Tuesday, October 1 Creating Habitats for Butterflies & Birds Featured Speaker: CJ McCartney



McCartney is a Master Gardener and vice president of the Palm Beach Native Plant Society. She specializes in creating wildlife areas that attract various pollinators. As a community project, she created a wildlife garden at a beachfront historical site. It was designed and installed with recycled materials, propagated plants and donated items. It won a statewide beautification award.

McCartney continues to learn, speak and write about outdoor living while experimenting with creating habitats that are in harmony with the environment.

#### Let's Plant Some Trees!

Saturday, September 22, 2018

We planned the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual WGC Tree Planting to coincide with National Public Lands Day (<a href="https://www.neefusa.org/npld">https://www.neefusa.org/npld</a>). We work closely with Brian Hopper, Supervisor of Wellington Forestry Operations, who selects the most needed location and best native trees/shrubs to be planted. This year we will be planting at *Peaceful Waters Sanctuary* in Wellington. Along with WGC volunteers, we invite the Boy and Girl Scouts in the area to join us as well as students and teachers from Wellington High School and Palm Beach Central High School.

No need to sign up in advance—just bring your kids, grandkids and friends and show up early. We do a big group photo before we head out to do the planting. Bring bug spray, sun hats, water, garden gloves and a good strong arm to help plant.

This year, Brian has selected about 500 native firebush, red stopper, myrsine and elderberry shrubs and trees to plant. Usually the holes are pre-dug for us which makes the job a whole lot easier. If we have about 50-60 volunteers, we can finish the job in about an hour and a half.

Welcome back to a new club season. As the new Youth Garden Chair, I am happy to report that WGC is sponsoring the following youth gardens along with these WGC liaisons/leaders: Kathy Schneider, Binks Forest Elementary; Kathy Siena, Girls Scout Troop 22222; Lisa Ferrano, Palm Beach Central High School; Twig Morris, Pine Jog Elementary (WPB); Roxanne Henry, Wellington HS and Tim Hadsell/Janet Stein, leaders, Wynnebrook Elementary (WPB). Once the groups get up and running, I will update you on their progress throughout the club year.

Roxanne Henry shared an update on a massive cleanup of the gardens and landscaping at Wellington High School. More than 125 students, parents, and faculty cleaned, mulched and trimmed the areas that we have been helping them with for the past six to eight years. The funds that WGC budgeted for the high school were used to purchase eight beautiful 25-gallon Christmas palms (Adonidia merrillii) which the students planted.



Barbara Hadsell, Parliamentarian and garden volunteer, described the Wynnebrook Junior Garden Club. "This afterschool program, comprised of approximately 15 4th and 5th graders, teaches children to plant and harvest organically-grown vegetables that feed the hungry and the homeless. The juniors also prepare a nutritious snack in the air-conditioned Elks kitchen and they take home some of the harvest for their own families. Volunteers are welcome to help in the garden and in the kitchen. We will be meeting on Wednesday afternoons at 2:45 in the Loaves & Fishes Garden beginning in mid-October." 


