#### **II. Committee Reports**

**F** Committee Chair reports: Still waiting on last year's committee chairs to provide their reports to Carol Coleman.

**G. Garden Tour:** Committee members are needed for Publicity, Hospitality, Ticket Sales, Golf Cart Acquisition and a Chair and Co-Chair. Tour date is Saturday, April 13, 2019 from 10:00am – 3:00pm. No tickets will be sold at gate. A meeting will be held soon to organize and strategize. Ticket prices will be \$100.00

**H. Around & Abouts:** Terrianne Tuskes shared that planning summer trips has been difficult due to unreturned phone calls from prospective venues.

**I.** Tickets to TKA: Stormi Bivin asked if the BOD wants to continue to offer group ticket sales to TKA. The consensus was yes. Stormi offered to continue to coordinate this effort.

**J. Habitat for Humanity:** Carol Coleman has received an Email from Linda DeSanti indicating that she must resign from this committee chair position due to work obligations. (Attached)

**K. Flower Show Report**: Twig Morris handed out the Tropical Heat Wave Flower Show Budget (estimated as of 5/30/2018). Copy attached. A profit of \$2,628.21 was reported. This has not been reconciled with the Treasurer's records.

**L. National Garden Week**: June 3-9, 2018. See flyer attached. Village of Wellington will write a proclamation and Twig will let the BOD know the date it will be presented to WGC. WGC will donate <u>The Saved Seed</u> to the Wellington library. During the week the club also will recognize the Wellington Green Mall for their sponsorship and hosting of the Tropical Heatwave flower show, and present flowers and plants to Wellington municipal offices and local businesses.

**M**. **Environmental**: Diane Rice reported that the Beach Clean Up will continue. Hosting a booth at the South Florida Fair does not receive member participation so she is not sure she will continue with this project.

#### III. Unfinished Business:

**A. Sunset Socials**: Some members have expressed an interest in reviving the Sunset Socials. A chairperson is needed in order to hold these fun fundraising gatherings again.

**B. Timing of General Meeting of WGC**: Barbara Hadsell commented that sign-ups are not happening and she feels it is because of the current format. Jan Seagrave commented that committee chairs are not coming early enough to place the sign-up sheets out so that members have time to sign up before the meeting has begun.
