Monday, January 7 Home Irrigation & Ways to Conserve Water Featured Speaker: Dr. Kimberly Anne Moore

Her research focuses on nutritional management of greenhouse crops, using alternative substrates and reclaimed waste water. Miss Saigon is a musical by Claude-Michel Schonberg and Alain Boublil, with lyrics by Boublil and Richard Maltby, Jr. It is based on Giacomo Puccini's opera Madame Butterfly and tells the tragic tale of a doomed romance involving an Asian woman abandoned by an American. The setting is relocated to 1970s Saigon during the Vietnam War, and Madame Butterfly's story of marriage between an American lieutenant and a geisha is replaced by a romance between a U.S. GI and a South

Vietnamese girl.

The musical premiered at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, London, on September 20, 1989, and closed on October 30, 1999 after 4,092 performances. It then opened on Broadway at the Broadway Theatre on April 11, 1991, and subsequently played in many other cities and embarked on tours.

District X Environment Chair Speaks About the LNG Plant in Florida—Diane Rice

Who would believe that when the US Congress passed laws to allow US liquified natural gas (LNG) production with a stipulation that it is not be produced or transported in densely populated areas, that we would find one such facility in the Miami area— namely, the Hialeah Rail Yard. What is Liquified Natural Gas?

When natural gas is cooled to minus 260 degrees Fahrenheit it becomes a liquid and condenses to 1/600th of the space it occupied as a gas. It is then put in cryogenic thermal containers and transported by road, rail and ship to its final destination. Occupying 1/600th of the space means LNG is 600 times more powerful than natural gas and should there be an LNG accident it would be more devastating.

This is what LNG accidents looks like.

The problem: In Florida, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has disclaimed congressional jurisdictional authority over the siting, construction, operation and maintenance of inland LNG export facilities. Developers are constructing LNG facilities on small parcels of with virtually no Federal oversight or transparency.

For example, American LNG Marketing is producing LNG on a 12-acre site in the Hialeah Rail Yard in Miami and transporting it over roads and by Florida East Coast Railroad, subsidiary of Grupo Mexico, between the LNG Facility and the ports of Miami and Everglades.

What we can do now? I cannot over-emphasize the seriousness of an LNG accident and its inherent liability. But there is still time to come up with a solution. WWALS Watershed Coalition (a 501-c3 and at wwals.net) has made it their mission to charge on with the fight that FERC should be regulating FL in matters of LNG production and transportation as per US law.

And as Floridians and as members of the Wellington Garden Club, we should strive to help them with some of the costs. I am open to a fundraiser, such as having a dinner presentation and selling raffle tickets in hopes of raising a thousand dollars or more. Or perhaps each garden club in our area could donate \$100 or more. I'm open to all ideas.
