## Presentation to General membership Wellington Garden Club February 3, 2020 Coral Reef Restoration

Each month we pass around this container and ask for donations for two very worthy causes:

Penny Pines restoration – NGC's effort along with US Forest Service to replant burnt or otherwise damaged forested areas, and

#### **Coral Reef Restoration**

I must admit I wasn't too clear on this latter program but a speaker for the Coral Restoration Foundation in Tavernier, Florida at the Tropical Short Course gave me a much better picture of the efforts being made to save our coral reefs and how the donations from Wellington Garden Club are being used.

Running from north of Miami down to Key West in the south, right on Florida's doorstep, lies the Florida Reef Tract.

It is the third largest barrier reef in the world and the only barrier coral reef in the continental United States.

The Florida Reef Tract was once dominated by two species of reef-building coral, staghorn (Acropora cervicornis) and elkhorn (Acropora palmata).

The Florida Reef Tract now hosts just three percent of the once-dominant staghorn and elkhorn cover that it had in the 1970s.

These became some of the first corals to be listed as "Critically Endangered" – one step away from a listing of "Extinct in the Wild".

What the Coral Restoration Foundation has developed is a method for "farming" and "outplanting" colonies of staghorn and Elkhorn.

By hanging finger-sized fragments of these corals to grow on Coral Trees™, they can produce colonies that are large enough to be out planted in just six to nine months.

There are 500 coral trees in Florida and in these nurseries they are growing these endangered staghorn and Elkhorn corals. When appropriate they remove the corals and literally glue them using a marine glue to the reefs.

To date, CRF has now planted more than 66,000 corals back onto the Florida Reef Tract. These corals are now spawning every year, helping to kick-start the reef's natural process of recovery.
