The plant that she chose is a miniature orchid, which is an Oncidium. It comes in various colors. It can grow up to 100 blossoms per month and will bloom for 2-3 months at a time. It is called "Twinkle". The prices vary.

One intermediate age garden-Girl Scout Troop 22222 and finally our high school youth gardens are Wellington High and Palm Beach Central High. Most of the gardens are thriving and doing well. Binks Forest Ele most likely will no longer be working with WGC to maintain a Jr Garden at their school.

I do, however, have good news for a potential new junior garden. School leaders and PTA moms from New Horizons elementary school in Wellington have contacted me to express their keen interest in working with our Club on gardens at their school. They have asked for our advice and support. They visited our Community Garden to see the boys and girls working in the garden and to see the butterfly/native plant garden that we have. We would like to accept their request and work with them on their JR garden projects. To do this, we need a new jr garden liaison from our club that would be willing to help and guide the leaders and garden kids.

I believe that each of you understand the importance of mentoring our youth in our community in the field of gardening. To quote the last and perhaps most important sentence in our mission statement, it says: to instill in our youth the love of gardening and the respect and protection of the environment. I would hate to have to go back to them and tell them, thank you for your enthusiasm to start a garden and ask for our help, but we don't have any adult leader that will help you. This report is not about a fundraiser. It is about WGC members giving back to our community and earth! When an opportunity becomes available to plant trees, I almost find it impossible to ignore. Former Village of Wellington staff member, Brian Hopper, informed me that he had an extra supply of seedlings that needed to be planted and would I be interested in organizing a special tree planting. WGC and other community volunteers came to the rescue and helped plant almost 1500 native Southern Red Cedar (*Juniperus silicicola*) tree seedlings in the Wellington Environmental Preserve on Flying Cow Ranch Road Saturday, Feb 15. I was expecting about 20 people but instead we had about 40 volunteers. WGC volunteers included some members from our Community Garden team and others, high school students and teachers from our sponsored youth gardens, Boys and Girl Scout youth and leaders, and of course the Village of Wellington staff.

The National Garden Clubs **“Plant America-Plant Trees”** challenge set before local garden clubs was picked up and carried forward by WGC! By having these tree plantings, WGC is also helping the global One Trillion Trees Initiative, an effort to bring together government and the private sector to plant new trees in America and around the world. We are acting as good earth stewards in the public and private sector by planting new trees. We are also giving back to our Wellington community. Thank you for your help and support.

- Annually, District X confers four (4) “unsolicited” awards in the public and private sectors for well-designed and maintained landscapes.
- “Unsolicited” means that the owner of the site has not requested to be considered - someone else (typically a GC member) admires the site and nominates them.
- There are four categories for nominations: Small Business, Public Facility, Private Facility and Private Residence. **(Refer to the STORY BOARD)** Some examples are: your local municipality’s community center, a gas station, a church, a library, a local business or even a home in your neighborhood.
- Any garden club member may nominate a property in his/her district. You may remember, a few years back, we nominated Adventure Mini Golf in Lake Worth – it won in the small business category.
- Nominations are in writing and sent to the District Chairman (C’est Moi!).
- A panel of judges, comprised of NGC Landscape Design Consultants, visits each nominated site to appraise and score, using the NGC Design School “*Standard For Evaluating Landscape Design*” score sheets. They assess things like *First Impression, Suitability of Design to Purpose, Functionality, Aesthetic Design Principles, Materials & Structures, Maintenance and a Final Impression.*
- Rules! There are always rules.....landscape must have been completed for at least one year and must be viewed from the street, and some other guidelines, of course.
- March 15th is the submission deadline for the 2020 nominations. Winners will be announced and awards presented to the nominating garden clubs at the 2020 Spring District X Meeting.
- Go drive around and look for a property with great curb appeal and nominate them! They just might win an award. THANK YOU!

VOW Commemorative Tree Program

- Last year, the Wellington **Tree Board** initiated a new program called ***The Commemorative Tree Program***. This recommendation was presented to the Village Council as a way to remember, pay tribute or memorialize a friend, family member or anyone that deserves recognition. It was unanimously passed by Council.
- A tree may be planted in honor of someone at one of our village parks. The program hasn't been widely advertised yet, but a few trees have already been planted at Village Park off of Pierson Road and Foresteria Park. The cost of a tree, installation and a plaque with the honoree's name on it is \$425.
- Should this be of interest to anyone, I have placed copies on the table of the official VOW form so you may see what the program is all about. The form is also available at VOW's website.



Commemorative Tree Program

Commemorative trees have become an increasingly popular way to remember, pay tribute to a friend or family member or acknowledge a birthday, wedding, or other milestone. If you would like to honor someone by sponsoring a commemorative tree at a park, please complete this form. Sponsorship of a typical 10'-12' tall tree is \$425 and covers materials, installation and a plaque. If a larger tree or an unusual species is requested then sponsorship rate would be adjusted accordingly. Plaques for deceased loved ones should read "In honor of" or "In celebration of" and shall not include dates. All plaques shall be subject to final approval by the Village.
