Some schools still do not allow volunteers inside the school grounds. The good thing about school gardens is that we can meet with the teachers and students outside to work on their gardens, as needed. They often work quite well on their own with our general advice and expertise as experienced gardeners-some in vegetable gardens and others in butterfly/native plant gardens. Unfortunately, one of our longtime and helpful youth garden liaisons, Roxanne Henry, has had to temporarily resign from any help with the school youth gardens, specifically Wellington High School and our newest addition, New Horizons. We thank her for all her years of service and teaching to the kids and hope she can return soon.

This brings me to the next school to talk to you about. Lisa Ferrano has kindly stepped up to help assist me and the school leaders at New Horizons Ele with their future butterfly garden. We are planning organizational meetings for the coming week. If you are interested in being the school liaison, please be sure to talk to me.

We have a new idea to propose regarding the butterfly garden near the dog park that the girl scouts have been managing for many years. Because of their school commitments, they are in dire need of more help with the garden. Lisa Ferrano is suggesting that we ask our members to help the kids with clean up at their butterfly garden on the same dates as the Adopt-A-Street occurs which is about four times a year. This is a perfect opportunity for new members to join in the work and fun while supporting our youth. More info to follow.

Today I'm going to demonstrate how to make a novelty arrangement for Thanksgiving. **Please note this is not** a creative design that one might enter in a flower show.

It's more like "Fun with Flowers" and it shows how to take \$8.00 worth of chrysanthemums from the supermarket, a few floral supplies from a craft store, and some greens from my yard to make something cute for Thanksgiving.

This fun little novelty arrangement is from a book called "The Frugal Florist" by John Klingel that I bought when the garden club visited his business in West Palm Beach exactly 11 years ago today. I know because he autographed it for me and dated it -11/2/09!

Sadly, the business is long gone, but you can still purchase the book online at Amazon. The Frugal Florist text takes inexpensive supermarket flowers and shows you how to put together a lovely bouquet step by step with illustrations. The author explains principles of design and use of color and shows how to make everything from a floral birthday cake to a holiday wreath. The photography is excellent and the directions are clear and easy to follow. Here's a sample of the instructions and pictures from the "Happy Thanksgiving" arrangement. Show pages from the book and describe.

This is a list of the supplies I used:

- 1/3 block of floral foam known as Oasis SHOW
- Clear floral tape to anchor the Oasis SHOW
- Wooden skewers from Publix SHOW
- Floral pics with wire SHOW
- Two bunches of chrysanthemums from Publix
- One yellow squash from Publix
- Several Petra croton leaves and ferns from my garden
- Red pipe cleaners (shown in the book) or felt (used on my turkey)

Here are a few photos of what I did to create my own arrangement.

PHOTO 1: Start with a low container and 1/3 block of floral foam. I a

PHOTO 1: Start with a low container and 1/3 block of floral foam. I anchored it well using clear floral tape.

The next step is to add the plant material. I bought two types of chrysanthemums: one was a single blossom on a very long stem, the other type had multiple blossoms on a single stem. **SHOW FLOWERS.**

First, I removed all the leaves. Next I cut the stems to about a 4" length. SHOW CUT FLOWERS.

PHOTO 2. Remember, when you're working with floral foam, once you insert the flower into the foam, try not to re-position it. Too many holes will make the foam unstable and you may have to start all over again. Also, it's helpful to have a small turntable since the arrangement will be viewed from all sides.

Then I wired floral pics onto the croton leaves because the stems were very short and hard to insert into the Oasis. **HOLD UP WIRED CROTON LEAF.**

Then I added the croton leaves and ferns to create the tail feathers and wings.

And finally I decorated the squash with eyes made from carpet tacks from my husband's collection of miscellaneous handyman items, and a red wattle cut from a 39 cent piece of felt from Michaels.

Do-it-Yourself Flowers on a Budget


Chapter 22 - "Happy Thanksgiving—Turkey Bouquet"

Gobble! No sweating over a hot oven with this "turkey." Here we have a turkey- shaped arrangement that will bring a fun and festive feeling to the table. Creating a novelty design with flowers is as easy as paint-by-numbers, and you can have one or many adorning your table at the holiday dinner. Many of the "ingredients" are right there in your local grocery store—how easy is that?! With these long-lasting flowers, you can create your "turkey" centerpiece several days in advance and enjoy it all through the holiday.

Use one-third block of floral foam in a low tray or cut to fit the container snugly inside. Trim and place the flower heads side-by-side to create a round ball or body of the turkey. To make your turkey bigger, simply add more flowers. You can use mixed-colored mums or roses for a fun look. For the head, use a yellow squash, securing it into the foam with a flower stem or wood pick, and pin two beads or capers for eyes. Cut a piece of red felt or use red pipe cleaners for the turkey's wattle, and pin it to the yellow squash. To fashion a tail, use a piece of palm, fern, or feathers. The turkey can be placed in a low basket or shallow bowl.

Design Tip

Add extra feathers, flowers, or green fern on the sides for wings.



Floral recipe: **Budget:** 2 bunches bronze spray mums (round) 1 palm leaf or 5 pieces of fern 1 yellow squash "Happy Thanksgiving block floral foam cut to fit container Turkey Bouquet" 1 low dish or tray Premium: 24 orange or fall colored roses fully opened (round) 1 palm leaf or 5 pieces of fern 1 yellow squash block floral foam cut to fit container 1 low dish or tray
