- A quorum was established by Kathy Schneider, Parliamentarian 11. A.
 - B. All cell phones, dogs, home phones, etc. were silenced.

 - 3. Committee Chair Budgets – Jan Seagrave will send out an e-blast to Committee Chairs to advise what their proposed budget will be for next year.
 - 4. Jan stated that Twig Morris had advised that the 360 at the Wellington Green Mall is available for meetings. We are trying to schedule future meetings for both the BOD and general membership at the 360 room except for this coming Monday, March 1. The meetings will start at 10:00 instead of 9:30. We can no longer hold our BOD meetings at the Wellington Community Center.
 - 5. Jan Seagrave brought up WGC's contributions to Penny Pines and Coral Reef Restoration. Do we want to send money to them this year? Twig Morris stated that these donations were set up to encourage our membership to support both of these causes.
