General Membership Meeting – 2/24/2021

We are moving forward with the plans for the Plant Sale which is Saturday, March 13 from 9:00am to 4:00pm. You all should have received the eblast last week which outlined the steps we are taking to comply with CDC COVID guidelines. We will supply all volunteers with masks and antiseptic wipes. We will also supply those volunteers who are exposed to visitors on a closer basis with face shields.

The Amphitheatre grassy/sidewalked area will be marked for a specific flow of traffic. Members will be assigned the responsibility of directing traffic to comply with social distancing.

I've prepared and printed a flyer which Stormi and I handed out at the Twilight Market this past Friday and will do so again at the Garlic Fest this coming weekend. If any of you would like to distribute any flyers to establishments you frequent, let me know and I will get some to you. I've also worked up a budget for the plant sale with an estimated profit of \$1375.00

Of course, we will have areas for member grown plants. We are also selling plants & flowers from 4 nurseries. Three (3) of those nurseries are working with us on consignment. We will sell fertilizer in 2 lb. bags for \$7.00/bag. We will also sell garden gloves for \$5/pair.

Stormi and I will visit the nurseries this week to choose plants from each.

There will be 3 shifts. Following are the number of volunteers we have so far for each shift.

7:00 AM to 10:00 AM --- 9 volunteers

10:00 AM to 1:30 PM --- 8 volunteers – 3 of whom are Master Gardeners

1:30 PM to 5:00 PM --- 4 volunteers

There are 10 individuals who have advised they have plants to bring. I am sure that there many others of you who also have plants started but just haven't had a chance to contact me.

Jan and I will go to the storage area to pull out the necessary items to set up next week.

Twig Morris has done a tremendous job with the press releases which have gone to the Town Crier and Palms West magazine.

Linda DeSanti and her husband have advised us that they have a truck available to pick up the plants at the nurseries on Friday.

The owner of the landscaped facility does not apply on his/her behalf; rather the facility is nominated by a District X member who feels it has merit. A team of evaluators will chose the winning landscapes. All landscapes must be able to be viewed from the street by the evaluators. Other rules apply (see form). The deadline for submissions is March 15, 2021.

There are four categories (small business, public facility, private facility and private residence), so there will be four winners. The winners will be announced at the Spring District Meeting.

Last year, several clubs participated and submitted eleven excellent nominations. As you are driving around, take note of the "curb appeal" of various properties and one just might catch your eye – that could be your next nomination for this year's award category. Take some photos featuring the aspects of a well landscaped business, public or private facility or a private residence and the write up the description on the attached form – short and to the point. “UNSOLICITED LANDSCAPE DESIGN AWARDS”
FOR PLANTINGS IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTOR

This project was planned to involve all members of the Landscape Design Consultants' Council for the purpose of recognizing and encouraging well-designed and maintained plantings in the public and private sectors. The awards are “unsolicited” in that they are not requested by the owners of the locations nominated. Nominees are not notified they are being considered.

Any garden club member, especially graduates of the NGC Landscape Design School, may nominate any well-designed and maintained landscaped area in the public or private sector in his/her District. Nominations are to be in writing and are sent to the District X Chairman.

This District Chairman will select panels of judges made up of members of the Consultants' Council (see current yearbook) of his/her District to evaluate the site nominated. Other interested GC members may participate on the teams. Judging will be done according to the NGC Standards-Evaluating Landscape Design. This Point Scoring sheet for the nominated site must accompany the application/entry form. The point scoring form can be found on the NGC website under Schools, Landscape Design forms, Standards for Evaluating Landscape Design or contact the President of the FFGC Landscape Design Consultants Council.

Categories eligible for nominations are:

1. Small Business (such as gas stations, fast food, etc.)
2. Public Facility (such as library, park, police station, etc.)
3. Private Facility (such as church, hospital, etc.)
4. Private Residence of merit

All landscaping must have been completed for at least one year.

All landscaping must be viewed from the street.

Submit photos with applications.

Winning certificates will be presented at the 2021 Spring District X Meeting.
