
We would love to see new members volunteer to work with our critically important youth. Are there any questions? Thank you for your attention.

I am happy to report that the Wellington Preserves is saved once again from development and thank the 10 WGC members who attended the Village of Wellington Council Meeting on April 5, 2021.

Attendance matters and our voice by show of numbers was significant. I also like to give a lot of credit to Drew Martin who represented Friends of Florida as a Board member and had 30 minutes to speak. He emphasized that the Wellington Preserves Map was made public when the mall was developed and that the owner / developer should not be given a new map just because he asked for it. If a new map would be approved then there would be a good likelihood that the developer would go back to South FL Water Management and ask them to reconsider changing the conservation provisions shown on the old map --- thereby allowing the developer to develop 17 acres of wetland preserves --- known as Wellington Preserves. The previous South FL Water Management meeting had a 4-4 tie to changing these wetland preserves -- marked as conservation only on the map -- to non-conservation.

At the end of the meeting there was a motion and second NOT to change the original Wellington Mall map. The vote was 3-2 with Mayor Anne Gerwig and Councilman Michael Napoleone voting in the negative.

The Environmental Chairman Diane Rice made it clear that this does not negate the possibility that the developer could come back again with some sort of request to develop Wellington Preserves.


