Installation of a Great Symphony Orchestra New Board of Directors

Will the new Parliamentarian please step forward.
It is your job to make sure during
meetings that all of "Robert's Rules of Order" are properly followed. Like the heralds of old, you have the authority on this subject. This
Trumpet represents that authority and the responsibilities of your office.
Will the new Corresponding Secretary please step forward. In your new position, you will handle all
the correspondence of the club just as the Native Americans communicated by the beating of the drum. This Drum is being given to you as a symbol of your office.
Will the Recording Secretary please step forward You are represented by the flute. A
recorder is one kind of flute. As the recording secretary, you shall keep the records of the meetings of the club, be custodian of all records and papers of this office and present any recommendations from the Board to the membership. This Flute is a symbol of your office.

Will the new Assistant Treasurer please step forward.
As the assistant, you shall serve at the direction of the treasurer. The assistant treasurer and the president shall act as alternates in the absence of the treasurer. A coronet is a small crown worn by a lessor royalty, so if the treasurer is the queen of finances, you as the assistant now receives the Coronet as your symbol of your office.
Will the new Treasurer please step forward. The treasurer is responsible for keeping an accurate account of financial records of the club. Because
these cymbals are reminiscent of gold coins, you are being given this pair of cymbals as a symbol of your office.
Will the 2 nd Vice President please step forward In your position you shall chair the
program committee and arrange for the upcoming club year's programs. You are comparable to the 2 nd violin in the orchestra and shall assume the responsibilities of the President and the 1 st Vice
President in their absence. You are receiving this 2 nd violin as a symbol of your office and responsibilities.
Will the 1st Vice President please step forward. As the 1st vice president, you are like
the 1 st violin. Under the careful instructions of the conductor the violin sets the tempo for the other instruments and carries the theme of the

composition. If for some reason the conductor finds it necessary to step down, the violin proceeds to lead the orchestra to the finished performance. This violin represents the responsibilities of your office.

Will the President please step forward. _____

As president, you bear the same relation to the conductor as he/she bears to the orchestra. The conductor does not need to be able to play all the instruments but should know how each should be played. Then when each member of the orchestra knows how his part should be played the entire composition will be in perfect harmony.
