Wellington Garden Club Members' Meeting Wellington Community Center April 4, 2022 @ 9:30am

I. Welcome - Maria Wolfe

- a. A quorum was established
- b. Everyone was asked to silence their cell phones
- c. We stood for the Pledge of Allegiance
- **II. Mary Barbara Alexander** introduced our guest speaker, Susan Lerner, who spoke about Native Plant Propagation and Seed Saving.

III. Executive Committee Reports

- A. President Maria Wolfe
 - 1. The Spring District Meeting will be held at the Little Club Private Golf Course in Gulfstream, FL. The Judges Council Flower Show (which Susan Hillson and Jan Warshauer had spoken about last month) will be held immediately after lunch. Susan Lerner will be the Keynote speaker. Maria Wolfe encouraged members to sign up for this luncheon.
 - 2. Maria W. asked members if they knew how much the Wellington Garden Club gives back to the community. The total is \$9,745.00! It is your dues, fundraisers such as your plant sales, fertilizers sales, Garden Tour and shredding event, that allows us to give back to this community. Maria asked FFGC how much was the total of all the garden clubs in the State of Florida and Maria was advised it was over \$200,000.00. That says a lot about the FFGC.
 - 3. Maria talked about the Penny Pines and where our donations are used and the Coral Reef Restoration. Maria shared in detail what the Coral Reef Restoration has accomplished. CRR has returned 102,395 corals to restoration sights in over 17,000 square meters of Florida coral reef. In 2020, they put 27,293 corals back into the wild: Staghorn corals, 15,000; Elkhorn corals, 6,000; Boulder corals that you see when you are snorkeling, over 5,000. Carysfort Reef is one of the most iconic reefs in the entire world. Over the last 40 years that reef was pushed almost to the brink of extinction. But thanks to a partnership between CRR and the Ocean Reef Club, Carysfort Reef is back on the map as a successful reef restoration.
 - 4. Maria asked the members who provided the wonderful refreshments for our social hour to stand and thanks were expressed through applause. One of Maria's goals as president is to make an environmental impact. WGC is now using cardboard cups, bamboo silverware, and reuseable tablecloths in an effort to reduce plastic consumption.
 - 5. Garden Tip of the Month Maria W. explained how to clean white residue from clay pots. In a spray bottle put equal parts of white vinegar, rubbing

- III.B.5 (Cont.) alcohol and water. Spray it on, use a brush and let it dry. The residue will come out. Once you have done that, you wash the pot completely before you put your plant in it.
