I. Meeting was called order at 9:34 AM

A. A quorum as established.

B. Maria Wolfe asked members to silence all cell phones.

II. Officer Reports

A. President's Report

- 2. Maria also advised members to pick up their yearbook and sign the sheet showing that they have done this.

We also discussed Coconut Coir. The public would have to be educated to just what this is and what the advantages are. She has chosen The Musical Ruth in January, The Music Man in March and Annie in April. d) Plant Sale – Carol Ralph reported that the Plant Sale will be in conjunction with the VOW Earth Day Celebration. We will be setting up in the grassy area just before you walk onto the promenade. We will have a table set up for children's garden crafts and will be selling member-grown plants, a combination of nurseries as vendors and onconsignment nurseries.

Coir, also called coconut fiber, is a natural fiber extracted from the outer husk of the coconut. Coco coir is an organic compound that adds to absorbency, water retention and drainage of potting soil. It is a great addition to garden soil. Use coir on its own to sprout seeds, propagate plants and provide support to root structures. Coco coir is inert, meaning there are no nutrients in the fiber. Coco coir is one of the most effective growing media for water retention. It can absorb up to ten times its weight in water. The roots of your plants will never dehydrate. However, since coir is inert, meaning it does not have any nutrients you will need to add nutrients to your water.

HYDRATING COCO COIR BLOCKS

- 1. Put the bricks in a large container. It will expand 5-7 times once hydrated.
- 2. Cover the brick with warm water. Bricks can be bought in different weights. Rule of thumb: add 4-5 gallons per brick.
- 3. Allow water to absorb for at least15 minutes
- 4. Once absorbed, fluffy the coco coir up until resembles soil-like

Consistency

One block makes two gallons of potting soil. 100% organic. Spongease Coco CoirBrick.

20/pk = \$119.99 = \$5.99 per brick

4/pk = \$21.99 = \$5.49 per brick Hodiax Premium CocoCoir Brick
