Small Standard Flower Show

As you will see in the 2024-2025 Yearbook, there are plans to hold an NGC Small Standard Flower Show on May 5, 2025 at Wellington National Golf Club in conjunction with our Spring Luncheon.

Maria Wolfe, who is in the process of becoming a Flower Show Judge, has agreed to be the Show Chairman. This will help her gain credit as she continues in Flower Show School.

This show will be on a much smaller scale than our past shows, thus it is called a Small Standard Flower Show. There will only be two Divisions: A Design Division with 12 designs and a Horticulture Division with a minimum of 20 exhibits, although there could be more than 20. It will not include Botanical Arts, Education or Youth Divisions. This will enable us to accomplish setup and tear down of the show in one day.

The show area will be separate from the luncheon area and will not interfere with the luncheon setup, or the luncheon itself, the scholarship awards and officers installation. At the conclusion of the luncheon following the officers' installation, the show will be open to WGC members and friends as well as to golf club members, their friends and the general public.

As required by NGC flower show rules, the members must officially approve the proposal to hold the show and agree to support it. For this reason, the members will be asked to vote at the September membership meeting. Hopefully, everyone will agree to support the show and help Maria and her committee chairs to produce another award-winning flower show for WGC.

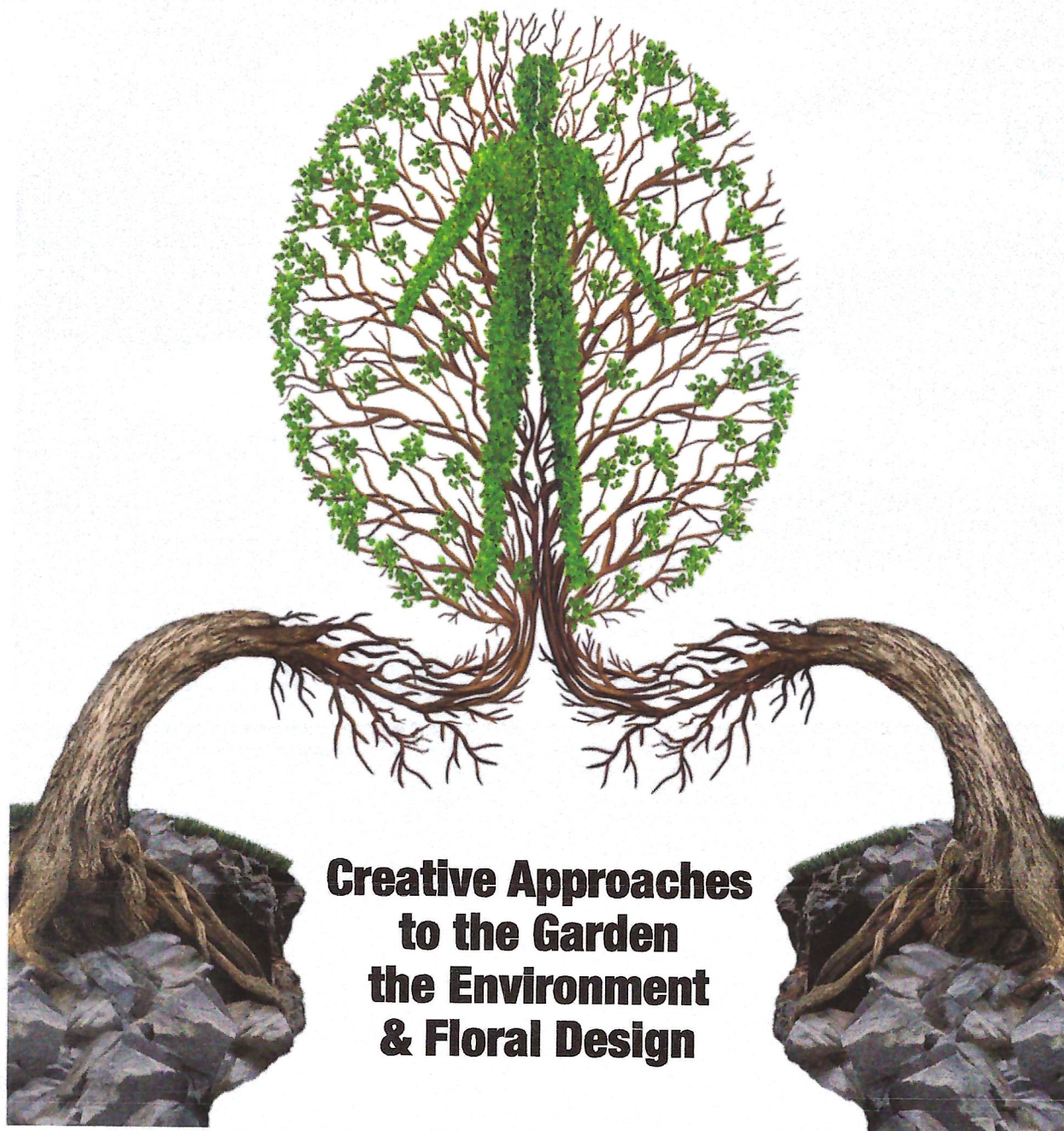

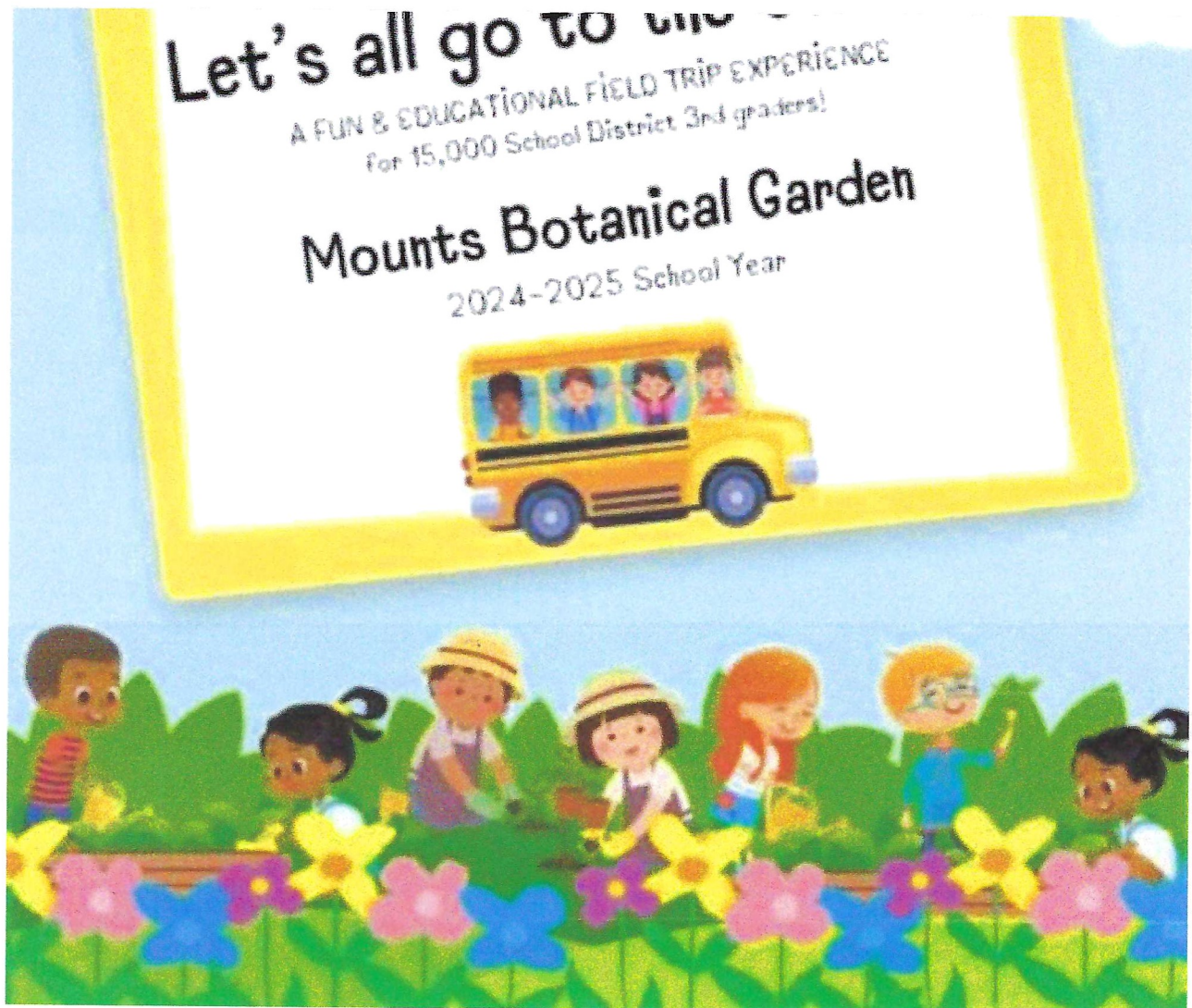

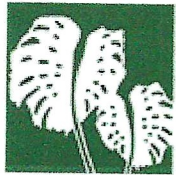

What Do Plants Look Like Up Close?

Students will use kid- and outdoor-friendly microscopes to see plant structures up close. Different options for viewing will include leaves, roots, flowers, soil, etc.

What Do We Eat?

Students will be shown different parts of plants to try to figure out what part of the plant we eat. Examples include:

- Celery - the stalk
- Radish or carrot - the root
- Spinach or kale - the leaves
- Broccoli or artichoke - the flower
- Corn - the fruit
- Peas - the seeds

Can You Match It?

Students will try playing a quick match game putting photos into different categories...and will be very surprised at some of the answers! Examples include:

- Bamboo - grass
- Corn - fruit
- Nuts - fruit
- Potato - vegetable
- Broccoli - flowers
- Thorns - modified stems
- Spine - modified leaf

Additional Discovery Station ideas include renewable resources such as solar, wind, and wave power; identifying different types of rocks and learning how they were formed; the Everglades, aquifers, and limestone; growing food in space (pending partnership with NASA); etc.

Pick Up & Grow Checklist

Planning Your Planting Project

- ☐ Determine the potential planting areas on your property
- ☐ View our list of available tree species, to determine the right tree based on your sites planting conditions (sun/shade/drainage, growth potential, etc)
- ☐ Call 811 to ensure desired planting locations are clear of underground utilities.
- ☐ Make sure you have volunteers to help plant and care for the trees over their lifetime

Complete Application

- ☐ Complete the Pick Up & Grow Application
- ☐ Please be patient as you wait for the CG team to review your application - this process may take up to a few weeks

Pick Up Your Trees

- ☐ Receive the coordinated date and time to pick up your trees
- ☐ Bring your own tarp, rope and/or bungee cords to secure your trees
- ☐ Pick up your trees at the CG Tree Nursery:
22313 Boca Rio Rd, Boca Raton, FL 33433

Plant & Care For Your Trees

- ☐ Plant and mulch trees per instructions given to you at pick up
- ☐ Water your tree using a 5-gallon bucket of water every 3 days
- ☐ Remove and keep weeds suppressed as they pop up

- ☐ Share with us photos of your event and outcome of project
- ☐ Tag us on Instagram and Facebook @communitygreening
- ☐ Complete follow-up survey

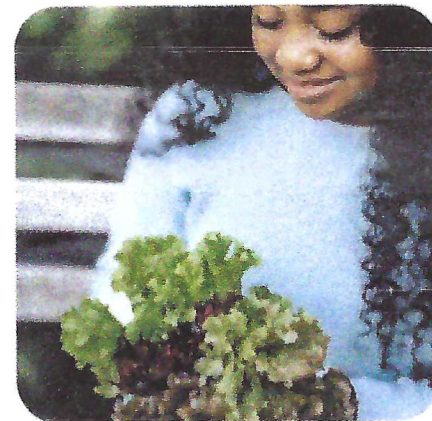
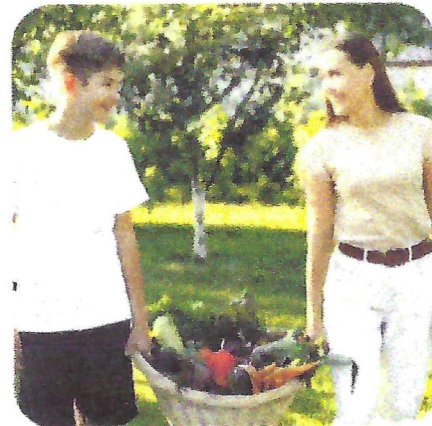
Excite and encourage youth to express and explore their creative thoughts through different types of poetry. NGC's Poetry Contest enables youth to embrace their creativity through the art of writing.

Local clubs send their winning poems (1 per grade-level in each category) to their State by the published State deadline. State winning poems are sent to their Region Contest by 2/1/2025. Region winners are sent to the National Contest by 3/1/2025. National winning poems are announced in May 2025, and published online in a free digital poetry booklet.

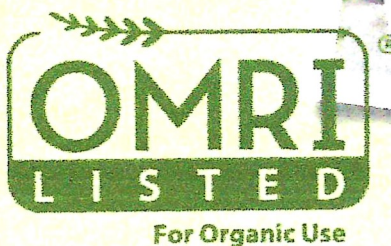
