Tom Ramiccio Bromeliads

Topic: Propagation of Bromeliads

When Tom Ramiccio ran out of space for bromeliads in his Lake Worth yard, he planted them on trees, creating a vertical garden of the colorful, water-holding "vase" plants. He estimates he has about 7,000 <a href="block">bromeliads</a> in his collection. He brings with him more than 40 years of professional marketing and Public Relations. He served 3 terms as mayor of the City of Lake Worth. He was the President/CEO of the Greater Lake Worth Chamber of Commerce (10 years). As the marketing manager for Banyan Printing he oversaw all major marketing campaigns for large corporate clients and several sports franchises. He served as the Marketing Director for the Palm County Visitors and Convention Bureau (over 10 years), Governor Florida District of Kiwanis International (37 years), Salvation Army board member (35 years). There is more but, needless to say, we are lucky to have him.

## Environmental Report for Sept. 9, 2024 by Diane Rice

#### Beach Cleanups

We are having two: Saturday - Sept. 14 with the Fabulous 4. I want to especially thank Linda Messina, Huguette Damas and Maria Wolfe who have been doing this with me for years.

This year I am adding a second Saturday - Sept. 21 which is the ICC official day because I am hoping WGC wins the District X contest of the highest % participation. The prize is \$100.

We carpool from St. David's Church leaving at 730 AM to go to John MacArthur State Park. Take PGA Blvd and go East to the ocean.

#### Florida Great Outdoors Initiative:

I want to talk about a Florida Environmental miracle that happened between August 20-29. A whistleblower leaked to the media that nine public hearings were to be held August 27th for nine Florida State Parks to have golf courses, hotels and pickle ball courts as part of Florida Great Outdoors Initiative. One such park was Jonathan Dickinson Park in Stuart, Florida. I heard about this on Tuesday, August 20th. Brian Mast - US Representative for Stuart - inquired as to the map and saw that 3 golf courses were slated for Jonathan Dickinson Park and held a press conference on Thursday, August 22nd which resulted in more public outcry. On Friday the public hearings were postponed. On Saturday funding from Tuskegee Dunes Foundation was withdrawn. You may recall that in 2011 Rick Scott as governor tried putting golf courses in our state parks only to find himself also stopped by the public.

Now the Florida Department of Environment Protection is run by the governor - so he thought. On Wednesday, August 28th Governon Ron DeSantis said these plans were half baked as he tries to find the whistleblower. The pressure mounts up such that the next day - August 29th it is declared that all the nine state park plans are withdrawn.

Unfortunately, on Sunday August 30th the whistle blower, James D. Gadds who was the Florida Department of Environment Protection DEP map maker was fired.

We can never be grateful enough to all those who protested to prevent this August 27th hearing. What we can do is write a letter to US Representative Brian Mast thanking him for his immediate press conference and showing himself as a Florida conservationist. I have submitted a preliminary letter for review.


