Tom Ramiccio Bromeliads

Topic: Propagation of Bromeliads

When Tom Ramiccio ran out of space for bromeliads in his Lake Worth yard, he planted them on trees, creating a vertical garden of the colorful, water-holding "vase" plants. He estimates he has about 7,000 <a href="block">bromeliads</a> in his collection. He brings with him more than 40 years of professional marketing and Public Relations. He served 3 terms as mayor of the City of Lake Worth. He was the President/CEO of the Greater Lake Worth Chamber of Commerce (10 years). As the marketing manager for Banyan Printing he oversaw all major marketing campaigns for large corporate clients and several sports franchises. He served as the Marketing Director for the Palm County Visitors and Convention Bureau (over 10 years), Governor Florida District of Kiwanis International (37 years), Salvation Army board member (35 years).
