Wellington Garden Club Treasurer Report

Income since October 1 is \$4,337.65; since June 1, 2024, income is \$12,394.34.

October's income is primarily attributed to the Endangered Panther fund-raiser w Oleander Garden Club (\$606.69 collected), Holiday luncheon tickets, The Kings Academy (TKA) fundraisers, October meeting plant raffle, Coral Reef Restoration member donation, and membership renewals.

Expenses since October 1 are \$3,010.98; since June 1, 2024, expenses are \$8,036.17.

October's expenses are primarily attributed to TKA ticket purchases, \$1,800 500 donation to the Garden Club of St. Petersburg, FL (from last month's Polacek/MacGregor Charitable Fund donation), storage unit fee, FFGC dues, Penny Pines and Coral Reef Restoration donations, and miscellaneous hospitality purchases.

Originally conceived as "The Spanish Memorial Church" to commemorate Prince de Leon landing in Forida in 1513, the Episcopal Church of Bethesda-by-the-Sea, a Spanish Gothic structure was built in 1925. In 1931, Nellie Cluett, whose parents were founding members of the church, decided to have a garden designed in their memory. The small garden, only 1/3 of an acre reflects an Italian influence, with water features, parterres, and tropical plants orchestrated on two highly detailed tiers.


